## **BRIEF RESUME**

Upinder Singh is currently Professor and Head of the Department of History, University of Delhi.

After studying in St. Stephenøs College and the University of Delhi, she obtained her PhD from McGill University, Montreal. She taught in S. Stephenøs College from 1981 to 2004. She was a recipient of the Netherlands Government Reciprocal Fellowship (1985\u00ed1986), Ancient India and Iran Trust/Wallace India Visiting Fellowship (2009), Daniel Ingalls Fellowship at the Harvard-Yenching Institute (2005), and Erasmus Mundus Fellowship at the University of Leuven (2010). In 2009, she was awarded the Infosys Prize in Social Sciences by the Infosys Science Foundation.

Her writings range over various aspects of the social, economic, religious and intellectual history of ancient India; the history of Indian archaeology; and the modern histories of ancient sites and monuments. Her research papers have been published in several Indian and international journals. She is the author of *Kings, Brāhmaṇas, and Temples in Orissa: An Epigraphic Study (AD 300-1147)* (1994); *Ancient Delhi* (1999); *The Discovery of Ancient India: Early Archaeologists and the Beginnings of Archaeology* (2004); and *A History of Ancient and Early Medieval India: From the Stone Age to the Twelfth Century* (2008). She has edited *Delhi: Ancient History* (2006); *Ancient India: New Research* (co-edited with Nayanjot Lahiri, 2009); *Rethinking Early Medieval India* (2011); *Asian Encounters: Exploring Connected Histories* (co-edited with Parul Pandya Dhar, 2014); and *Buddhism in Asia: Revival and Reinvention* (co-edited with Nayanjot Lahiri, 2016). She has also written a book for children, *Mysteries of the Past: Archaeological Sites in India* (2002). Her most recent book is *The Idea of Ancient India: Essays on Religion, Politics and Archaeology* (New Delhi, Sage, 2016). Her current research interests includeancient Indian political ideas and the connections between South and Southeast Asia.
