The Regulations governing Certificate, Diploma and Post Graduate Diploma courses in Tulu is assented by the Honorable Chancellor on 20.03.2019 as communicated in Government letter cited to reference (2) above and the same was approved by the Academic Council meetings reference (1) above are hereby notified for implementation with effect from the academic year 2019-20 and onwards.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING CERTIFICATE , DIPLOMA AND POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA COURSES IN TULU

(Framed under Section 44 (1)(c) of the KSU Act 2000)

Preamble:

Tulu is one of the developed Dravidian languages with a history of more than 2600 years. There are about ten million people who claim Tulu as their mother-tongue. Most of them live in the coastal Karnataka and in the adjoining Districts of Chikmagalore, Kodagu, Shimoga and in Kasaragod District of Kerala. Besides being the mother-tongue of such big population, Tulu functions as a *lingua-franca* in the region.

Recently, the Karnataka Government has issued an order to teach Tulu as 3^{rd} language for the students from 6^{th} standard to 10^{th} standard from the academic year 2010-11 in the District of Dakshina Kannada and Udupi.

In view of the Governments initiative, the Mangalore University has taken steps to start Certificate, Diploma and Post Graduate Diploma courses in Tulu under Correspondence Course. Since most of the educational institutions coming under the jurisdiction of Mangalore University are interested in starting these courses, it is decided to frame separate regulations to start Certificate, Diploma and Post Graduate Diploma courses as regular programme. Hence, the regulations.

1. TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT:

- i) These regulations shall be called **"the Regulations governing** Certificate, Diploma and Post Graduate Diploma Courses in Tulu."
- ii) These regulations shall come into force from the date of assent of the Chancellor.

2. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

i) <u>Certificate Course in Tulu</u>:- Candidates who have passed S.S.L.C. examination conducted by Karnataka Secondary Education Examination Board or any other examinations considered as equivalent thereto shall be eligible.

- ii) <u>Diploma Course in Tulu</u>: Candidates who have passed the two years Pre-University examination conducted by the Pre-University Education Board in the State of Karnataka or any other examinations considered as equivalent thereto shall be eligible or candidates who have passed Certificate course in Tulu are also eligible.
- iii) <u>Post Graduate Diploma Course in Tulu</u>:- Candidates who have passed any 3 years Bachelor Degree of Mangalore University or any other University considered as equivalent thereto are eligible and they shall have also completed Diploma course in Tulu.

3. DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME:

- i) The duration of **Certificate Course in Tulu** shall extend over a period of six months.
- ii) The duration of **Diploma Course in Tulu** shall extend over a period of one academic year.
- iii) The duration of **Post Graduate Diploma Course in Tulu** shall extend over a period of one academic year.

4. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:

The medium of instruction and examination shall be in Tulu and Kannada Script will be used for the purpose of curriculum and instruction.

5. HOURS OF INSTRUCTION:

- i) <u>Certificate Course</u>:- There shall be 8-10 hours of instruction per week totaling 150 hours of instruction for the Programme
- ii) <u>Diploma Course</u>:- There shall be 15-18 hours of instruction per week totaling 600 hours of instruction per year.
- iii) **<u>P.G. Diploma Course</u>**:- There shall be 15-18 hours of instruction per week totaling 600 hours of instruction per year.
- 6. ATTENDANCE:

Each paper shall be treated as an independent unit for the purpose of attendance. A student shall attend a minimum of 75% of the total instruction hours in a paper including tutorials and seminars. There shall be no provision for condonation of shortage of attendance and a student who fails to secure 75% attendance in any paper is not eligible for appearing the examination of that paper. He/she shall be required to repeat that paper by attending the classes.

7. MAXIMUM PERIOD FOR COMPLETION OF THE PROGRAMME:

The candidate shall complete the programme within three years from the date of admission to each programme.

8. SUBJECTS OF STUDY:

- i) <u>Certificate Course in Tulu</u>: Basic knowledge of Tulu Language, Communication Tulu etc.
- ii) <u>**Diploma Course in Tulu:</u>** Tulu Language, Tulu Literature, Tulu Folklore and Culture, Communication Tulu etc.</u>
- iii) <u>Post Graduate Diploma Course in Tulu:</u> Tulu Language, Tulu Literature, Comparison study of Tulu with other Dravidian Languages, Tulu Folklore and Culture etc.

and any other subjects introduced by the University from time to time.

9. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION & INSTRUCTION HOURS:

There shall be examinations at the end of academic year ordinarily during April/ May for Certificate Course and October/ November for Diploma Course and Post Graduate Diploma Course in Tulu. The scheme of examination are as below:

9. INTERNAL ASSESSMENT:

- 9.1 Marks for internal assessment shall be awarded on the basis of seminars, tests, assignments etc., as determined by the Board of Studies from time to time. The internal assessment marks shall be notified on the department/ college notice board for information of the students and it shall be communicated to the Registrar (Evaluation) at least 10 days before the commencement of the examinations.
- 9.2 Internal assessment marks shall be shown separately in the marks card. A candidate who has rejected the result or who, having failed to take the examination again, shall retain the internal assessment marks already obtained.

10. REGISTERING FOR THE EXAMINATIONS:

A candidate shall register for all the papers in the subject when he/ she appear for the examination for the first time.

11. VALUATION OF ANSWER SCRIPTS:

Each theory paper shall be evaluated by eligible examiners as decided by concerned Board of Studies.

12. MINIMUM FOR A PASS:

- 12.1 No candidate shall be declared to have passed in the examination unless he/ she obtain not less than 40% marks in the University Examination in each theory papers/ Viva and 40% in theory and internal assessment marks put together.
- 12.2 There shall be no minimum in respect of internal assessment.
- 12.3 A Candidate who fails in any of the theory paper shall reappear in that theory paper and pass the examination subsequently.

13. CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES:

The results of successful candidates at the end shall be classified on the basis of aggregate marks obtained.

Percentage of marks for declaring class:

First Class with Distinction	70% and above
First Class	60% and above but less than $70%$
Second Class	50% and above but less than $60%$
Pass Class	40% and above but less than $50%$

14. **REJECTION OF RESULTS:**

- 14.1 A candidate may be permitted to reject the result of the whole examination. Rejection of result paper-wise/subject-wise shall not be permitted. A candidate who has rejected the result shall appear for the immediately following regular examination.
- 14.2 The rejection shall be exercised only once and the rejection once exercised shall not be revoked.
- 14.3 Application for rejection along with the payment of the prescribed fee shall be submitted to the Registrar (Evaluation) through the study Centre together with the original statement of marks within 30 days from the date of publication of the result.
- 14.4 A candidate who has rejected the result is eligible only for class and not for ranking.
