

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THREE YEARS – SIX SEMESTERS B.A DEGREE PROGRAMME IN SECURITY AND DETECTIVE SCIENCE

(Framed under section 44(1)(c) of the KSU Act 2000)

PREAMBLE:

The new syllabus for Security and Detective Science is framed with the objective of developing an academic support for security and detective personnels. The principles of security remain constant but the environment in which they have to be applied is continually changing. A systematic knowledge in the specific subject and interlinked subjects is must to become successful Security or Detective Personnel. By this, the security system can improve in quality and prevent the crime. In addition, with basic knowledge of crime, law, detective methods and other interlinked subjects the system of police or private security can deal strongly with a crime. The private security system is developing all over the world with vast demand and there is a need to develop an educational system for Security Management and Detective, which is the most important and crucial need of the present society.

The graduates in the above degree have a plenty of chances in private security companies and detective agency functioning all over the world. This course is useful to the candidates who desires to join police or any other such departments.

Objectives:

1. To create awareness of different kinds of Security system to the students.
2. To acquaint students with the knowledge of Crime, Human Psychology, Social problems, Geographical study, and Human Behavior etc.
3. To study the legal system, particularly Indian Police Act, Evidence Act, and Criminal Procedure code etc.
4. To help the students to acquaint with the knowledge of modern techniques of detectives, use of instruments and Computers.
5. To acquaint students' with the knowledge of national language Hindi and international language English along with the subjects interlinked for security and detectives.

Faculty: The qualification of the teaching faculty shall be M.A. Criminology, M.A. Sociology, M.A. Psychology, M.A. History, LLB/LLM, M.Sc. Anatomy, M.Sc. Physics, and diploma holders in detective science.

1. TITLE & COMMENCEMENT:

- i) These regulations shall be called “the Regulations governing three years – six semesters B.A. degree programme in Security and Detective Science”.
- ii) These regulations shall come into force from the date of assent of the Chancellor.

2. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

The candidates who have passed the Pre-University examination conducted by the Pre-University examination Board in any discipline in the state of Karnataka or any other examination considered as equivalent thereto by Mangalore University are eligible.

3. DURATION OF PROGRAMME:

The duration of the programme shall extend over six semesters. (Three academic years) of 16 weeks each. Each Semester shall consist of 16 weeks of study. (Excluding the time spent for the conduct of final examination of each semester)

4. SUBJECT OF STUDY:

Subjects of study shall comprise the following:

4.1 Group I: Languages:

The candidates shall opt for general and communicative English as compulsory subject and one of the languages listed below.

Kannada, Sanskrit, Hindi, Urdu, Persian, Arabic, Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam, Marathi, French, German, Russian, Konkani and additional English (Additional English is applicable for Anglo Indian and NRI students only).

4.2 Group II: Optional Subjects:

Basic Concept of Criminology, Social Problem & Crime, History & Development of Investigation, Criminal Psychology, Security Management & Investigation, Civil Law, Civil, Criminal & Investigative Institutions, Security & Vigilance, Anatomy non-Medical, Criminal Law, Geographical Study of India & World Map, Investigation methods & Techniques, Labour Law & Welfare, Evidence Act, Basic Computer, Police Act, Police Science & Police Administration, Documentation, Report Writing & Professional Ethics, C A D, Use of Detective Appliances, terrorism & its Prevention, Physiology, Criminal Justice & Medical Jurisprudence, Project Work, etc.

4.3 Group III:

Foundation Courses: (i) Constitution of India and (ii) Human Rights, Gender and Environmental Studies shall be as compulsory subjects, alternately, in the first and second semesters.

4.4 Co-and Extra Curricular Activities

A student shall opt for any one of the following activities in the first four semesters offered in the college

- A) N.S.S. / N.C.C / Rovers and Rangers
- B) Sports and Games
- C) Other Co-and Extra-Curricular Activities as prescribed by the university

Evaluation of Co-and Extra Curricular Activities is as per the procedure evolved by the university from time to time

5. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION & INSTRUCTION:
