

About Mangalore University:

Mangalore university Campus located about 20 km to the South-East of the historic coastal town of Mangalore. The sprawling picturesque campus spread over 333 acres, overlooking the confluence of the river Nethravathi with the Arabian Sea on the one side, and the cloud-capped Western Ghats on the other is center of academic excellence.
