Notwithstanding anything contained in rule 11 to 13 the State level committee and District level Committees constituted to inquire into the cases of sexual harassment against women in working places after having conducted an enquiry on the Government servant shall submit a report along with details and documents, such report shall be considered by the competent disciplinary authority and keeping in view the nature and gravity of the proved misconduct, any one or more than one punishment specified under rule 8(i) to (viii) shall be imposed. An opportunity of being heard shall be given to the accused before imposing such penalty.

Provided that the commission shall be consulted before passing such order in any case for which such consultation is necessary."

## DRAFT AMENDMENTS TO THE STATUTE GOVERNING CLASSIFICATION, CONTROL AND APPEAL RULES OF EMPLOYEES OF MANGALORE UNIVERSITY

(Framed under section 40(1)(O) of the K.S.U. Act 2000)

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### **1. TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT:**

- (1) This statute shall be called "The amendments to the Statute Governing Classification, Control and Appeal Rules of Employees of Mangalore University.
- (2) They shall come into force from the date of assent of the Chancellor.

### **Insertion of new rule 12(ii): Procedure in cases of sexual harassment against women:**

Notwithstanding anything contained in rule 11 to 12(i), the University level committee constituted to inquire into the cases of sexual harassment against women in working places after having conducted an enquiry on the employee shall submit a report along with details of documents, such report shall be considered by the competent disciplinary authority and keeping in view the nature and gravity of the proved misconduct, any one or more than one punishment specified under rule 7(i) to (viii) shall be imposed. An opportunity of being heard shall be given to the accused before imposing such penalty.

Provided that the commission shall be consulted before passing such order in any case for which such consultation is necessary.






**RESOLUTION**

To make necessary changes in course credits, teaching hours per week and Assessment marks in the AECC course on Indian Constitution to meet the requirement in view of the University's decision to teach this course as compulsory course in 3<sup>rd</sup> /4<sup>th</sup> Semester in place of open elective course.
2. To prepare a model question paper for End Semester Examination for 60 marks.
3. To recommend to the University to prescribe minimum qualification (eligibility) to teach AECC course as Masters degree in Political Science or Law with a minimum of 55% marks or equivalent grade.
4. To forward the revised syllabus and model question paper to the University for further action.
